

Car & Bike Show at DFO on Sunday 4 September – club members required for half hour shifts to assist with car marshalling – 3 members indicated they will assist. There was discussion around asking attendees if they had fire extinguishers in their vehicles. Kurrimine Beach Hop on weekend of 9 to 11 September. General Business:

- 1. Ric Montgomery (original member No. 5 when the Club was formed 25 years ago) has re-applied for membership endorsed through a show of hands.
- 2. Innisfail "Car Show & Chamois" reduced from 3-day event to just Friday & Saturday due to forecast heavy rainfall Trevor attended on the Saturday and mentioned numbers of around 1500 people.

- 3. Club caps to be sourced from Totally Workwear at a cost of \$15 so members can purchase for \$20 endorsed through a show of hands.
- 4. Jesse celebrated his 17th birthday this week
- 5. The Fat Bastards Car Club held a Poker Run on Friday 13 August during which a Mustang caught fire; fortunately, 2 vehicles had fire extinguishers (1kg) on board and minimal damage was caused. Bob Aller put a recommendation to the meeting that prospective members have a fire extinguisher in their vehicle, as a condition of applying for membership this was amended to changing the Membership Application Form to include a check-box where prospective members can indicate there is an extinguisher in their vehicle/s. Passed by a show of hands.
- 6. James proposed that the Club donate its usual \$250.00 to the Swap Meet takings; seconded by Kristie endorsed.

- 8. Xmas Party proposed to be held at Rainforestation on the last Sunday in November (27^{th} to be confirmed) with a Buffet lunch at \$20/head. Endorsed by the majority.
- 9. James' 57 Pontiac is going into quarantine for 4 weeks.


